3. OVERVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMME


3.1 Executive summary

In the reporting period the Programme entered into the next stage of implementation since so far almost all projects selected for the financing by the JMC within the 1st CfPs (65 out of 67), all LIPs (10 projects) as well as the first micro-projects within the 2nd CfPs have been contracted. Almost all of them (52 projects from the 1st CfPs and all LIPs) have started implementation of their activities by the end of reporting period after the issuance of the notification by the EC referred to in Article 25(4) of the IR i.e. 4th July 2018.

The total amount of projects contracted by the end of the reporting period makes 182 272 326,58 EUR (with 161 936 815,66 EUR of EU-funding). The Programme budget allocation (EU-funding) to contracted projects and payments in division to specific thematic objectives is presented below:

During the reporting period the Programme structures have launched the 2nd Call for Proposals (CfP), which was opened from the 1st August till 31st October 2018 only for the Thematic Objective HERITAGE and its both priorities.

In this Call, the beneficiaries had to submit only the Application Forms (no Concept Note phase) which were subject to assessment and to the final decision on co-financing.

Promotion and preservation of natural heritage

Within the reporting period the employees of the JTS performed administrative/eligibility/quality assessment of submitted applications. The meeting of the Project Selection Committee (PSC) dedicated to selection of applications submitted within the TO HERITAGE took place on 26 March 2019 in Warsaw.

Following the PSC recommendations, the Joint Monitoring Committee decided on 17 April 2019 during its meeting in Niasviž (Minsk oblast, Belarus) to select 74 micro-projects for financing. 1 of them resigned from contracting in the reporting period (and additional 3 since its end). Remaining 70 projects are represented within the priorities as follows: 53 projects under priority 1.1 Promotion of local culture and history and 17 projects under priority 1.2 Promotion and preservation of natural heritage. The first micro-project grant contract was signed in the reporting period.

Since part of the allocation for the 2nd Call (total allocation 5.2 MEUR) remained undistributed, the 3rd Call for Proposals (supplementary one) was decided to be launched in the fourth quarter of 2019 - devoted to micro-projects and thematic objective HERITAGE.

3.2 Progress achieved in implementing the Programme and its Priorities

Within the reporting period the following key performance indicators were achieved:

- 74 Full Application Forms selected for financing by the JMC (2nd CfP);
- 51 grant contracts for projects signed between the Managing Authority and the Lead Beneficiaries (75 grant contracts cumulatively from the beginning of the Programme implementation);
- 1 meeting of the JMC;
- 1 meeting of the Project Selection Committee;
- 4 trainings on contracting for beneficiaries (1st CfP and LIPs) in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine;
- 13 trainings for beneficiaries on projects implementation and reporting (1st CfP and LIPs) in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine;
- 1 training for Polish beneficiaries on procurement procedures;
- 3 communication trainings-workshops for beneficiaries (1st CfP and LIPs) in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine;
- 30 trainings for applicants of the 2nd CfP in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine;
- 2 Partner Search Forums (in Lublin, Poland and Brest, Belarus);
- 3 trainings on contracting for beneficiaries (2nd CfP and LIPs) in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine.

3.3 Problems and achievements reported by project applicants and beneficiaries

In 2018, projects contracted within 1st CfPs stepped into their implementation phase. After the issuance of the notification by the Commission referred to in Article 25(4) of the IR i.e. 4th July 2018, first 7 projects began realisation of their physical activities. By the end of the reporting period another 46 projects were launched. In total, 53 projects worth 92,76 M EUR were implemented in the reporting period (82% of the Programme allocation available for regular projects).

Since there were no projects' progress reports submitted by the end of reporting period, no physical achievements were noted.

3.3.1 Summary of issues reported

Main issues reported by the beneficiaries were connected with the process of initiation of projects' implementing phase i.e.:

- Lack of notification by the Commission referred to in Article 25(4) of the IR which were a condition of beginning of projects implementation phase,
- Long lasting process of national approval of projects in Belarus (concerning Belarusian beneficiaries) which negatively influenced on the start date of projects.

Additionally beneficiaries located in Poland reported problems connected with high prices on the building market which were significantly higher than prices calculated in project budgets on the stage of grant application.

Minor issues were reported by the applicants with relation to the e-application software usage.

3.3.2 Success stories

Not applicable, projects just started their implementation during the reporting period. No projects' progress reports were submitted by beneficiaries by the end of 2018.

Two thematic trainings for the fire-rescuers were held in March and June 2019. Awareness raising campaign is in its active phase.

The project was registered in accordance with the Ukrainian law. The Lead Beneficiary ensured funds for the project co-financing in 2019 year and started to prepare tender documentation for works. The Beneficiary 1 (Frederic Chopin Regional Clinical Hospital No. 1 in Rzeszow) signed a contract with the project auditor, launched call for the project staff and started to prepare tender documentation for purchase of medical equipment. The Beneficiary 2 prepared tender documentation for purchase of the key medical equipment, i.e. computed tomography scanner and X-ray machine.

The tender procedures were carried out and the contracts for works were signed with the contractor "Velt Capital" LLC in November 2018. Execution of the construction activities started without delays, partial works on construction of sewage collectors and installation of pipes were completed in the reporting period.

4. PROGRAMME MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

4.1 Summary of main activities

Main activities performed by JMC

During the reporting period 1 meeting of the JMC was organized:

• 17 April 2019 – Niasviž, Belarus

During the meeting the following important decisions were made:

- The amount of 176 881.55 EUR was transferred from the Programme TA budget to the TO SECURITY in order to enable financing of the projects on the reserve list (1st CfP).
- The JMC approved the Project Selection Committee Report from the 2nd CfP assessment and selection including list of 74 projects recommended for financing.
- The JMC decided to launch the 3rd CfP for the remaining budget from the 2nd CfP (at least 1 054 015.79 EUR).

Main activities of the MA undertaken in the reporting period:

- preparation (with the assistance of the JTS-IB) Programme documents submitted for the approval of the JMC;
- overall co-ordination of the evaluation process of the project proposals submitted within the 2nd call for proposals and chairing the Project Selection Committee;
- handling complaints submitted by the applicants of the 2nd call for proposals;
- participation in events/seminars/workshops/meetings on the Programme implementation organized by TESIM, INTERACT, European Commission;
- participation in Programme events (Annual Conference, seminars and trainings for the applicants/beneficiaries);
- conducting risk assessment for the PL-BY-UA Programme;
- contracting of the projects (from the 1st call for proposal and 1 project from the 2nd call for proposal);
- paying out of the advance payments to the project beneficiaries;
- updating of the MA Procedure Manual;
- modification of the JTS Procedures Manual and approval of the amended version of the document;
- preparing procedures and arranging the technicalities with OLAF to be included in the IMS
 (Irregularity Management System) and be able to report irregularities via the system for the
 whole Programme, as it had been stipulated in the Note to the MAs in charge of ENI CBC
 Programmes 2014-2020 on the notification of irregularities. The inclusion of the Programme
 in the IMS module is presumed for the fourth quarter of 2019;
- conducting a systemic control of the JTS's and Polish CCP's performance and realization of entrusted tasks.





Main activities of the JTS and Branch offices

During the reporting year the structure of the JTS established in previous year has remained unchanged at the level of 20 people.

With regard to Programme 2014-2020 implementation the JTS and BOs organized and financed the following events:

- Meeting of the JMC on 17 April 2019 in Niasviž (Belarus);

- Assisting awarded beneficiaries of PBU1 and the LIPs concerning training on implementation and communication workshops in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine;
- Assisting 2nd CfPs applicants by organizing two Partner Search Forums, training for applicants, individual consultations in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine
- Many communication and promotional events (full list of these activities can be found in p. 4.4.1).

The JTS and BOs employees took active part (presentations, panels, information stands etc) in several events organised by national (Polish, Belarusian or Ukrainian) organizations, in some cases with co-organization and financing from the Programme TA (full list of these activities can be found in p. 4.4.1).

In the reported period employees of the JTS continued preparing the grant contracts providing numerous individual consultations for the beneficiaries of the selected projects within 1st CfPs. Additionally the JTS organised in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine few seminars for lead beneficiaries on project implementation and information activities.

In connection to the 2nd CfPs all employees of the JTS from the beginning of November 2018 until end of February 2019 took part in assessment process of the received application forms. After the meeting of the JMC in April 2019 they have started preparation of the grant contracts providing individual consultations for the beneficiaries of the selected projects.

In addition, several working meetings of the JTS staff with the BOs staff were organized regarding the Programme and projects related issues.

Besides, the JTS employees as usual took part in various trainings improving their professional qualifications as well as foreign languages skills.

The BOs in Poland, Belarus and Ukraine continued performing their tasks in the reporting period under the service contracts signed between them and MA. Main activities carried out by BOs, except for providing consultations regarding participation in the Programme and assistance to the JTS in daily tasks implementation, included:

- organization and assistance in conducting of trainings for projects within 1st CfP (on Polish side),
- organization of the JMC meeting in Niasviž (Belarus);
- organization of the Annual Programme Event in Hrodna (Belarus);
- assistance to the JTS in organization of most of the Programme events listed in the point 4.4.1.
- monitoring of approval and registration of projects in Belarus and Ukraine;
- assistance to the JTS in translation, proof-reading of documents, drafting of news for Programme web-site.

Main activities of the CCPs and NAs

The Belarusian CCP has maintained the list of auditors entitled to verify the project expenditures incurred by Belarusian beneficiaries, which was set up earlier. The 2nd call for the auditing companies to take part in the selection process was announced on 20th of September 2018, the list was updated accordingly. On 10-11th September 2018, the Belarusian CCP organized the meeting with TESIM, Belarusian NA and Programme's authorities in Minsk.



During the reporting period the list of auditors entitled to verify the project expenditures incurred by Ukrainian beneficiaries was set up by the Ukrainian CCP.

Polish CCP continued to authorise Polish auditors entitled to verify the project expenditures incurred by Polish beneficiaries. In addition, it has organized a CCP meeting, which took place on October 30-31, 2018 in Warsaw and was dedicated to practical aspects of control functions.

During the reporting period one training for Polish auditors was organized in Warsaw on 12th June 2018.

CCPs have jointly updated the Guidelines on Expenditure Verifications.

Problems related to the Programme management activities were not identified. Regular working contacts between the MA, JTS-IB, BOs, CCPs and NAs can be assessed as very useful for managing the Programme.

The NAs of each participating countries were in close contact and cooperation regarding the Programme implementation issues.

The NA in Poland conducted a second meeting of the self-assessment team for the risk analysis for the Programme. The meeting took place on 31st October 2018, with participation of the MA, Polish NA (responsible for coordinating the programme management and control system) and the JTS and Polish CCP. The analysis was carried out in line with the assumptions of the European Structural and Investment Funds Guidance for Member States and Programme Authorities "Fraud Risk Assessment and Effective and Proportionate Anti-Fraud Measures". The analysis and meetings of the team take time on annual basis. The next analysis is planned for autumn 2019.

The NA in Poland introduced a new procedure related to the anti-fraud measures. The Institutions: the MA, the Polish NA and the JTS, while performing their respective tasks, have been obliged to use the IMS Signals mechanism to exchange information on suspected fraud and corruption between institutions under different operational programmes.

Main activities of the AA

The Audit Authority carried out system audit, at the level of Managing Authority and Joint Technical Secretariat, between November 2018 and January 2019. Results were presented in the Annual Audit Report. Management and control system was assessed in category 2.



4.2. Management of the calls for proposals

Within the 1st CfPs during the reporting period 42 grant contracts for the above projects were signed between the representatives of the MA and the lead beneficiaries. In terms of Large Infrastructure Projects all grant contracts (10) were signed as well.

Within the 2nd CfPs 250 Application Forms received. The total value of submitted projects amounts to over 15.3 million euro while the total value of requested EU co-financing is 13.6 million euro (almost 3 times bigger than the allocation foreseen for this CfP). More than 460 organisations from three countries declared being ready to implement the projects. Within the reporting period 74 Application Forms were selected for financing by the JMC and 1 grant contract for the above projects was signed between the representatives of the MA and the lead beneficiary.



Map B: Organisations involved in grant contracts within 1st CfPs



Map B: Organisations involved in grant contracts within 2nd CfPs



4.3 Monitoring and evaluation (max 2 page)

As a general, rule monitoring system for the Programme is based on the information received from the beneficiaries, who are obliged by the Grant Contract to submit narrative and financial reports to the JTS. The system is based on narrative and financial reports submitted together with payment requests as well as start-up reports and six-months brief narrative reports submitted independently from the payment requests. Data received from beneficiaries is compiled at the Programme level in order to prepare annual Programme implementation report and other monitoring information. Additionally the JTS is authorized to conduct on-the-spot checks and monitoring visits during projects implementation. These activities are conducted in accordance with the yearly plan of checks and ad hoc, if necessary.

During the reporting period the JTS received 74 Start-up reports from beneficiaries (regular and LIP projects). These reports are submitted to the JTS within 3 months after the Grant Contract has entered into force. They include the information about setting up all necessary project management structures and procedures and let the JTS project managers to monitor the initialization stage of the projects implementation. No major precaution measures need to be enforced following the reports submitted within reporting period.

Additionally by the end of June 2019 beneficiaries submitted 35 brief narrative reports covering the period of first six months after starting implementation. The reports indicated proper project





realisation in majority of projects, however minor delays in part of projects connected with their launching phase were also observed.

Since the implementation of the first projects started on 4th July 2018, no interim progress reports (to be prepared one year after contract signature) were submitted.

Due to the early stage of projects implementation as well as a lack of projects achievements and submitted interim financial and narrative reports no on-the-spot checks were conducted. First checks are plan to be performed at the beginning of 2020.

Data on signed contracts are included in SL2014 (Polish national IT system for programmes/projects management) for monitoring purposes and provided to KEEP database.
